Alberta Provincial Respiratory Strategy - Update

Along with our Partners (The Lung Association, Alberta Asthma Centre, Alberta Strategy To Help Manage Asthma & COPD), we are preparing to request funds to establish the Alberta Provincial Respiratory Strategy (APRS), a province-wide strategy that will enable accessible and high quality diagnoses and management of respiratory diseases. To date, there have been 4 consultation meetings, engaging cross-provincial professionals and stakeholders. To get involved, contact us anytime. A number of deliverables have been identified as a result, along with the following DRAFT strategic agreements:

The APRS goal is to improve the standards, outcomes, and cost-effectiveness of respiratory care in Alberta, so that more Albertans have healthy lungs and live full and active lives.

This will be accomplished by supporting interdisciplinary evaluation and care teams; formalizing collaborations, optimizing patient self-management; and coordinating better service access. Initial deliverables include solutions related to spirometry, sleep disorders testing, and disease education.

Global Lung Health Symposium - March 2008

Edmonton – This symposium featured international faculty and highlighted that poor lung health is an increasing health problem for resource limited countries as well as vulnerable communities (e.g., First Nations) in Canada.

<u>Highlights</u>

The tobacco epidemic is a global challenge. Data from WHO (World Health Organization) shows that 2/3 of the world's smokers are primarily from 10 countries with 40% of these being from China and India. A new global strategy for tobacco reduction is called *MPOWER* which stands for:

M-Monitor tobacco use and prevention policies

P-Protect people from tobacco smoke

O-Offer to help people quit smoking

W-Warn them about the dangers of tobacco

E-Enforce bans on tobacco advertising, promotion and sponsorship

R-Raise taxes on tobacco

Another area of interest was learning about the use of PAL (Practical Approach to Lung Health), a comprehensive approach to standardize case management of various lung problems. Some of the challenges in standard case management in third world countries include a need for the following:

- government commitment to strengthen the health care system
- involvement of health care providers at primary care and referral levels
- poverty reduction (housing) also has to be addressed
- projects need to be targeted, locally driven
- funding and implementation can benefit from emphasis on outcomes
- sufficient and well planned human resources are needed for successful implementation

He was also drawn to the willingness to expand research in the Calgary Health Region.

His 'down time' centres around his wife Tamara and his 2 golden retrievers - Kula and Capri – who he affectionately calls his "boys". When they aren't giving him a workout, Warren likes to spend time hiking, mountain biking, fishing, golfing, SCUBA diving, snowboarding, and snowshoeing (to name only a few!).
